

# Chairman's Note

As Christmas approaches I look forward to the visit of Father Christmas on the 19th of December when there will be a Christmas Carol service in Jubilee Square.

It's disappointing that another year has passed and we still don't have a park and playground at the centre of Buckingham Park. However, we continue to work towards getting this resolved. We have arranged a meeting with AVDC and Buckingham County Council to discuss the park and the adoption process. A representative from Taylor Wimpey has been invited in the hope that progress can be made with all the interested parties around the same table.

Our MP, John Bercow, visited our Community Centre on the 12th of December. It was great to have the opportunity to tell him the 'Buckingham Park story' and he has offered support in helping to get our long overdue facilities.



The care home is nearing completion and they are advertising for staff. We look forward to welcoming their residents when they open in the New Year. Construction has caused some issues, notably when deliveries have been made between 7.45am and 9am. The site manager has worked to minimise these occurrences and has responded quickly when we have raised problems with him.

The link road to Berryfields opened shortly after our last edition. Concern has been raised in relation to the 50mph speed limit which many think is excessive. Transport for Buckinghamshire has informed me that a consultation to lower the speed limit to 40mph is underway although the time scale is unclear. It is also important to note that the link road remains the responsibility of the developer, Kier, until adoption and will therefore not be automatically gritted during the winter. Please take extra care when using it in cold weather.

I would like to thank Jan and the staff at the Community Centre for hosting the Halloween party. Once again it was a sold out event and the parents and children who came along had a great time.

What does 2015 hold in store for Buckingham Park? The construction of the final houses should take place and we will be ever closer to becoming a completed development. This is assuming the Government Inspector does not overturn the decision of AVDC and grant permission for an additional 220 houses just to the North of us. Hopefully we will finally have our park and play area. The Parish Council will come to the end of its first term at the May elections and councillors will need to stand for election if they wish to be reappointed. Lots to look forward to and there will be more great events at the Community Centre.

Please note that the footpath between Chaundler Drive and Beeston Lane is not a public footpath. It is privately owned by the residents so please respect their land and do not use it.

If using the other roads and paths such as Chaundler Drive, Malford Crescent, Founders Path, Battle Meadow, Bursars Path, Charles Pym Road and Wykeham Path please do not cycle at

excessive speed or let your dogs foul in front of

peoples homes.

## **Planning Update**

Planning Permission has been granted for a crematorium in Watermead at the site where the Rivera Restaurant is currently located. Despite many objections submitted to AVDC the planning committee decided that there were no technical grounds for refusing planning permission and the final decision has been delegated to planning officers. This means that planning permission has been granted for two crematoriums in Aylesbury and we surely do not need both but it is now up to each developer to decide if they want to go ahead.

The Government Inspector will report back by the 26th of January in relation to the planning application for 220 houses just to the North of Buckingham Park. The Parish Council objected to the application both in principal and due to what we perceive to be poor design and layout. We will provide an update via our Facebook page as soon as we know the outcome.

The Public Enquiry in relation application to build 1500 houses to the East of Watermead is currently in progress. Again, we will provide an update as soon as we get an update.

# **Residents Open Forum Meeting**

Thank you to everyone who came along to the Open Forum meeting we held at the end of October. Over 50 residents attended. It was a great opportunity to provide an update in relation to Buckingham Park and hear what issues and priorities residents want for our community. While many issues relate to the ongoing construction of Buckingham Park and adoption we were able to take away several action points which we are already working on.

The next open forum meeting will be on the 17th of February 2015 at the Community Centre at 7pm

# Driving when Icy

Like other residential areas in Buckinghamshire we are not on a gritting route. The Parish Council has provided a number of gritting bins around Buckingham Park. Please help by spreading grit on roads and public footpaths when it is icy to make it safer for all of us.

Also, please be careful on the new link road as that will not be on the Counties gritting route until it becomes adopted. As it passes over a flood plain and marshy ground it is susceptible to ice.



# A Message from Thames Valley Police



To the residents of Buckingham Park - we at Thames Valley Police would like you to have a safe happy and fun Christmas this year. With this in mind here are a few tips to avoid suffering from crime in this festive time.

### When buying products on-line

If you shop, bank or make transactions online, please consider the crime prevention advice below to make sure that your personal details are protected from fraudsters and computer hackers:

- Is your web browser security set to the highest level?
   Examples of web browsers are Internet Explorer,
   Firefox, Mozilla.
- Use the latest version of a web browser for added security. Use automatic updates to keep your computer and web browser security up-to-date.
- Is there a padlock symbol at the bottom of the web browser and 'https' at the start of the web address? If they are not there, don't enter any bank or card details.
- If you are concerned, telephone the company to ask about its online encryption.
- Print out electronic receipts and keep them in a safe place.
- Check bank and card statements to make sure that the details match.
- Never give out your Personal Identification Number (PIN) to anyone - this includes anyone who claims to be from your bank.
- Your bank will never ask you to re-enter your account information. They will never ask you to send your PIN number in an email.
- For more information, visit the Financial Fraud Action UK website. Financial Fraud Action UK is a banking group that works with police and retailers to help prevent credit card fraud.

If you are a victim of internet fraud, report it by calling your bank or credit card company directly. They will verify the crime and report it to Action Fraud. This reduces bureaucracy and speeds up investigations.

### **Bank Safe Online**

Bank Safe Online is the UK banking industry's initiative to help online banking customers to stay safe online. For more information, visit the Bank Safe Online website

### **Personal safety**

- When Christmas shopping be aware of how much you are carrying with you - iPods, digital cameras, mobile phones, and extra cash to buy presents means you could be the ideal target for thieves.
- When you are out and about at Christmas don't leave your bag unattended, keep your purse safe in an internal pocket and don't carry your pin number with you.
- Don't leave your drink unattended. It takes a matter of seconds for someone to tamper with your drink.
- Have you ever considered getting a personal safety alarm? Don't allow threats of crime intimidate you into never going anywhere alone, just be aware of what's going on around you and be confident that you can keep safe.
- Plan your journey home. If you use a taxi, ensure it is registered. If you have to walk home, try and walk with a friend, stick to well lit and busy streets, and make sure someone knows the route you are taking.

### Theft from vehicles

- Make sure nothing is left on display in your car. Even small belongings such as clothing or small change can be tempting to a thief. Never think leaving items in the boot is safe either, who is to say someone didn't see you leave them there?
- The bill if your car is broken into:

Excess for insurance: £50+, or paying to have the window fixed - £200

Stolen presents: £250

Having your car valeted to remove glass: £15 Left feeling annoyed, stupid and embarrassed, not mentioning present-less. It's not worth it! Lock your vehicle, leaving nothing of value inside, to ensure a crime free enjoyable Christmas!

- Help drive thieves crackers this Christmas by giving extra thought to your personal and vehicle security. When considering where to park, look for a well lit, busy area.
   For additional security look out for the Park Mark security approved car parks.
- Never leave your keys in the ignition while your vehicle is unattended, even for a few minutes. Opportunistic thieves will often steal cars that have been left with the engine running to defrost the windows.
- Car crime accounts for more than a quarter of all reported crime in the UK, so always take precautions and lock your car, making sure windows are closed, even if you're away from your vehicle for just a few minutes.
   Additional security such as adding a steering lock is also recommended.

### **Burglary**

- Property mark presents and valuables with your postcode, house number or name, then register on Immobilise (the national property register). Make a note of all model numbers and serial numbers of all electrical items.
- Keep presents out of view placing presents in plain view of windows will only draw attention to your house and its contents.
- Be cautious when using social media such as Facebook – do you really want to advertise that your home is empty by showing you are somewhere else or having a countdown to your holiday?

- Invest in a timer to open and close your curtains or turn on your lights, or better yet, ask a family member or neighbour to pop in and do it at random times of the day so a potential thief does not see an exact pattern.
- Dispose of boxes and rubbish discreetly. Leaving boxes outside will give away the fact that you have new and valuable items in the house.

# Scouting at Buckingham Park

9th Aylesbury Scout Group has been in Buckingham Park for many years now. Previously situated in the portacabin and now in the excellent Community Centre. We offer quality Scouting for boys & girls in both our Beaver Colony (ages 6 to 8) and our Cub Pack (ages 8 to 10½). The Scouting ethos is, to quote our Chief Scout Bear Grylls, "Every child deserves an adventure!" and we aim to provide both adventurous activities and also practical skills for both Scouting and the world around them today. BUT without Adult support we cannot deliver as much as we'd like. We currently have vacancies for Adult Leaders, as well as Children, in both our Beaver & Cub sections.

Adult Leaders are trained in a modular system that is world recognised as one of the best as regards working with young people. You are assigned a mentor as well as a local training advisor PLUS the expertise of all the other Leaders within the Group & District. The aim is to be fully qualified, as a Leader, within two years. All applications are initially subject to a DBS check (formally known as

CRB) which enables you to work safely with the Children in your care. You are then helped along the training road with specific "modules" targeted at your particular role in Scouting. There are regular progress meetings and support, as previously stated, is only a telephone call or email away.

Scouting is a voluntary organisation and at local level no one is paid, other than for expenses, for their time. We are 108 years old in 2015 and want to see another 100 years but need YOUR support to enable us to get there.
