## Visits to St James Church

## Getting to know our new Docto

## Seasonal Flu Vaccination

Flu (also known as influenza) is a highly infectious illness caused by the flu virus. It spreads rapidly through small droplets coughed unpleasant on the air by an infected person. For most peop week.

Four months has gone by so quickly and soon there will be another trainee doctor for you to meet. I appreciate it is not always easy seeing new staff but you have helped me so much. ## THAMESVALLEY

There have been very few reports of ASB within the Buckingham Park area recently though officers will continue to patrol and respond to any requests for assistance.
Thames Valley Police are asking residents to follow the following advice

Are you tempting criminals by leaving property in your vehicle?

Do not leave property/ valuables on display inside your vehicle when it is parked up - take it with you.

- Don't 'hide' property in the glove box, boot or other compartments in your vehicle - thieves know all the places to look
Remove your Sat Nav from your vehicle. Don't leave the cradle on display and remove any sucker marks from the windscreen, as these may tempt someone to take a closer look inside your ca
- Make sure your vehicle is locked and the alarm engaged if you have one. Thames Valley Police often gets reports of thefts of valuables from unlocked cars
- Report anyone acting suspiciously around parked cars Try to get a description of them, along with the direction they are going in. If they have a vehicle try to see what make, model and colour it is and the registration number Call it through on 101 at the time you see it and if a crime is in progress dial 999
Have you taken a few simple steps to protect your home from opportunist thieves this Winter?

At this time of year there are traditionally more opportunist burglaries particularly between 5 pm and 7 pm when it is dark outside and people are yet to return home from work. Officers will be patrolling neighbourhoods and burglary hotspot areas across the area to identifying houses that may be at greater risk of burglary
Here are a few things you can do to protect your property

- Don't leave your home in darkness advertising the fact there is no one at home. Invest in a timer light switch and vary the time it comes on each day to make it look more natural. It can also be used with a radio or TV to give the impression that someone's home.
- Perhaps purchase a fake/simulated TV device which lights up a room like a real TV.
- Keep valuables out of sight and mark them with your house number and postcode using a UV pen.

Register your valuables at www.immobilise.com and keep an inventory list. It's free and takes just a few minutes.
If you have jewellery at home, photograph it for insurance purposes and consider storing it in a suitable safe

- Lock your doors and windows. If you have a UPVC door make sure you have double-locked it by lifting the handle and locking it with the key. Make sure the key is removed from the lock and out of reach
- If you're going away, remember not to post details of your holiday on social networking websites, cancel any milk or newspaper deliveries and, if you have a burglar alarm, make sure it is set before you leave
Look out for your neighbours' houses, especially when hey're not at home, and call 999 immediately if you see anything suspicious. If you want to report something which se call Thames Valley Police's non-emergency number 101
Christmas and Personal Safety
- When Christmas shopping be aware of how much you are carrying with you. Mobile phones, iPods, digital cameras and extra cash to buy presents means you could be the ideal target for thieves.
When you are out and about at Christmas, don't leave your bag unattended, keep your purse safe in an interna pocket and don't carry your pin number with you.
Don't leave your drink unattended. It takes a matter of seconds for someone to tamper with your drink.

Have you ever considered getting a personal safety alarm? Don't allow threats of crime intimidate you into never going anywhere alone, just be aware of what's going on around you and be confident that you can keep safe.
Plan your journey home. If you use a taxi, ensure it is registered. If you have to walk home, try and walk with a friend, stick to well-lit and busy streets, and make sure someone knows the route you are taking.
