Unitary What?

There may well be a big change coming to our councils. Currently, we have separate County and District Councils. Working out which council does what and who is responsible for getting issues sorted out can be difficult.

There is therefore a proposal to simplify things and have a single council. Typically, rather than have one plan, the two councils have launched separate plans and are promoting their own plan over the other. A finer example of why we need a single council to replace both could not be found.

What does this mean to you?

Residents won't get a say on which plan, if either, gets adopted. The decision will be made by the Government. However, judging by the County Council plan which has been publically launched, residents would see a single point of contact for all council matters, a significant devolution of property and management of local facilities to Parish Councils, and a reduction in council tax. There is also the small matter of saving roughly £50m over the first 5 years which is badly needed to provide services by councils that have been financially crippled by Government cuts.

What Happens Next?

The County Council has launched its proposal and the District will launch its vision for a smaller, Aylesbury Vale unitary authority in January. The minister responsible is likely to decide which proposal is favoured at the end of January 2017. If we are to have a new, single council, it should start to operate in 2019.

Not the most exciting article but this is a change that will affect all of us and is happening without many people being aware of it.

School News

This year has been really busy at Buckingham Park Church of England Primary School. Our School continues to grow and we have now grown to over 400 pupils. It is very exciting to see our school developing year on year. Here are some of the highlights since the last edition of Park News:

Year 5 Visit to Green Park

In September, our Year 5 class enjoyed a residential visit. The children and staff visited Green Park in Aston Clinton for two days, with an overnight stay. The children were able to explore the vast areas of park and woodland, and also enjoyed a ropes course, archery, team challenges and climbing.

The evening activity was a special team 'quiz' which involved some children getting messy with flour and others getting wet with water. Great fun was had by all!

Year 4 Sleepover

In November, our Year 4 children had the excitement of staying in school overnight. Evening activities, all based around the theme of teamwork, included pyramid construction, 'blind' obstacle course, giant skip and tower building.

The children turned their classrooms into 'bedrooms' and enjoyed breakfast together in the morning.

Energize at the Waterside Theatre

Buckingham Park pupils in Years 4 and 5 (90 children) participated in Energize at the Waterside Theatre at the beginning of November and they were amazing!

The children performed 'Play on Words' alongside children from other local schools. 'Play on Words' is the story of school children discovering the joy of poetry.

Energize is a festival provided by the Bucks Area Education Alliance. The festival started over 20 years ago at the Swan Theatre in High Wycombe. Energize is now at the Waterside Theatre in Aylesbury so that the children of Aylesbury Town can share in the magic of taking part in the performing arts on a professional stage.

The festival is a combination of individual school performances, couples with the collaboration of many schools coming together to create a larger piece of work incorporating dance, music and drama.

Our children and staff all worked really hard in preparation for the performance and their loud applause was very well deserved!

Defrosting vehicles reminder - Buckingham Park

The Aylesbury Vale Neighbourhood Policing Teams are reminding residents not to give opportunist criminals easy access to your vehicle in cold weather.

It is tempting to start your vehicle and leave it unattended while it is defrosting. When it is cold outside it might seem attractive to wait in the warm, maybe while you finish your breakfast, drink your coffee or pick up forgotten items before heading to work.

This can be the ideal time for thieves to steal your vehicle (which at this point is nicely defrosted). It only takes a moment and the first you might know about it is when you leave for work or the school run and discover your car is gone.

Even if you have locked your car it only takes seconds for someone to break a window and get in. It is also highly unlikely that your insurance company would pay out under these circumstances.

Be on your guard if you pop back into the house. Don't leave doors insecure while you pick up last minute items and don't leave vehicle keys where they could easily be picked up by someone reaching inside the door.

If you see anyone acting suspiciously around parked vehicles please call in through to the police on the 24 hour number 101. If you suspect a crime is actually happening at that moment please dial on 999.

Community Concerns Who should I contact?

Using the social networking site Facebook to report concerns and issues around Buckingham Park may seem the best way to share and find the right information, however our local Aylesbury Policing Team advise using the following telephone numbers/email provided by AVDC website.

If it's a criminal matter? Report the incident to Thames Valley Police on 101, or 999 if it is an emergency.

If you have information about a crime, but would like to report it anonymously call Crimestoppers on 0800 555 1111.

If it's a hate crime (racial/homophobic/disablist incident) report the incident to Thames Valley Police on 101 or 999 in an emergency.

If you or the person responsible for the Anti Social Behaviour is a tenant then contact your housing provider who will have a specialist officer who will deal with ASB matters.

If you are a tenant of the Vale of Aylesbury Housing Trust contact your neighbourhood manager on 01296 732600.

If you or the person responsible is a home owner / occupier contact the Public Safety Team on 01296 396093 or 396094.

If the problem is due to excessive, persistent noise or public health issues contact Environmental Health team on 01296 585605.

If you want to report an abandoned vehicle please note the make, colour and registration number along with the location, then call 01296 585076.

To report graffiti - Email contractservices@aylesburyvaledc.gov.uk with details of the content, location, date and time you noticed it, if it's on private property, AVDC can make the owner aware and request them to remove it.

To report a concern about the safety of a child you may want to contact Social Services on 01296 383999 or out of hours the Social Services Care Line on 0800 137915.
