## Chairman's Notes

There seems to be a lot to catch up on after the summer and my last update in Park News.

Within Buckingham Park we have started the process of replacing the benches along the greenways. They are now over 10 years old, many have already failed, and the remainder are unlikely to last much beyond this winter. We are also taking the opportunity to review the placement.

After many requests from community groups and residents we have installed a Defibrillator to the front of the Community Centre. It will be accessible in an emergency by calling 999 who will provide the code to open the box.

As noted in the last edition of Park News Buckinghamshire Council have adopted Colonel Grantham Way and most of Prince Rupert Drive (excluding the section in phase 3 from Malford Crescent round to where the footpath emerges from Rede Close). This means that faulty streetlights and pot holes should now be reported to Buckinghamshire Council using Fixmystreet. There have been no updates on the progress of adoption of other areas of Buckingham Park but we chase regularly for information and push the need for adoption.

Like many communities we are experiencing a problem with disposable vapes. Not only are they being sold to underage users they are also being disposed of irresponsibly. If you use disposable vapes please dispose of them at home or in bins.

We are getting a significant number of complains about dogs off their lead around the children's playgrounds. Please keep dogs on leads around these areas and be sensitive to residents who are not comfortable around dogs. Ideally use the meadow area by the river if your dog enjoys time off of a lead.

The empty shop unit on Jubilee Square has been empty for a few months following the closure of Barnardos. Many residents have speculated or asked me about the future use of the unit. While nothing definite has been confirmed (as I write this update) the Parish Council was recently asked to support a proposal to open a café. We were happy to support such a proposal as many feel that a café in a on the square would be a great addition to our community. I am hoping we will hear more on this possible development soon.



The summer also saw the first of two Boundary changes in relation to how Buckingham Park is represented in Parliament and at Buckinghamshire Council. The first change took place at the end of July when we moved from the Buckingham Constituency to be part of a reshaped Aylesbury Constituency. The second change will be for Buckinghamshire Council where we will become part of a new Ward which will cover Berryfields, Buckingham Park and Watermead. This will come into effect at the next local elections in May 2025.

Some time ago Buckinghamshire Council announced that Buckingham Park would be included in a trial for Demand Responsive Public Transport (what many might know better as a dial-a ride type service). This was to be a solution to help residents get to the new Surgery in Berryfields, and elsewhere, and was much anticipated. Unfortunately, the selected operator withdrew from the scheme and Buckinghamshire Council had to go out to tender again. This process is ongoing though I was told this week that Buckinghamshire Council hope to have the tender concluded before Christmas. I really hope this can be resolved and the service delivered as it seems to be a success where it has already been launched in High Wycombe.

I would like thank Cllr's Andre Beukes and Christine Donohoe, who recently stood down from the Parish Council, for their time and work for the community. I am also pleased to welcome James Baxter who joined the Parish Council in September. We currently have two vacancies on the Council so if you are interested in supporting our community and help to run the Parish Council please contact myself or our Clerk Keith Gray for more information.

## Parish Events

# **Council Bins**

The parish council has seen a large increase of household food waste being dumped in public bins and would like to remind residents that these bins are for general public use only. Dumping of household waste causes a knock on effect to the community as it either blocks or fills the bins up before its regular collection date meaning members of the public are not able to use the bins along with an increase of litter as rubbish placed on top of the waste is prone to being blown by the wind into the streets. We have also seen evidence of food from apps such as Olio or TooGoodtoGo appear in council bins so another reminder to residents using these services to be responsible.



# **Bus Shelters**

The parish council is taking steps to manage and maintain the current bus shelter and consider installing a new shelter elsewhere in Buckingham Park. Further discussions will take place on this proposal.

## **Community Defibrillator**

The parish council have now invested in a community defibrillator along with an outside cabinet to store the device year round ensuring its available every hour of the day. To open the cabinet in an emergency call 999 and quote your location for them to be able to provide the code, alternatively the community Centre staff can open the cabinet should they need to. Research has shown that deploying a defibrillator within 3–5 minutes of collapse can produce survival rates as high as 50 – 70%, to locate public use defibs across the country visit www.defibfinder.uk.



## Dog Mess

We still have a problem with dog owners not cleaning up after their dog mess. The main park is full of dog mess, and it is disgusting for the maintenance workers as it clings to the grass cutters and sprays up towards the driver of the ride-on mower. It is also not pleasant for children to have to play in a park full of dog mess. It is an offence not to clear up after your dog, so please respect your community and clear up after your dog.
