Chairman's Notes



Happy Summer! It has been an exciting few months as, after years of work, the Parish has taken over the ownership of the parks, greenspaces and playgrounds in Buckingham Park. Hopefully the first changes are noticeable already. The Parish have started proper maintenance (including Bin emptying) and grass cutting which has been neglected by developers in recent years.

We are removing the dead trees and the broken play tunnel in the park behind the school will be removed soon as it was never fit for purpose. The Parish Council will shortly start to make a plan for the refurbishment of the play areas and set a budget. We will then consult with residents to see what features the community would like before creating a final plan.

We have our annual Carnival on the 20th of July. Last year we changed to a new format with more live music. We are going to put another great day but hopefully the weather will be a little kinder to us this year. Come along, have fun and enjoy the music.

The saga of our roads being adopted carries on. We are working on getting Taylor Wimpey and Buckinghamshire County Council in the same room to at least agree what is causing the delays. Currently, Taylor Wimpey is due to create two raised platforms at the junctions of Prince Rupert Drive and Chaundler Drive and Peacock Lane. We are also chasing to get Culpepper Close finished but that is being delayed by the completion/ adoption of Price Rupert Drive.

The planning application for the new Berryfields Surgery was submitted some weeks ago. Details of the new GP facility can be seen at www.berryfieldsandmeadowcroft.co.uk. Buckingham Park was never due to have a permanent GP practice but we have been the home for Berryfields Surgery for the last 10 years while the practice tried to secure land in Berryfields. Over the years I have worked closely with the practice managers and have looked at various options to try and keep the GP surgery in Buckingham Park but none met the needs of the practice. I have noted that a number of residents have objected to the planning application because of concerns about public transport links to the new site. This is a genuine concern the GP practice working group is very aware of and work is underway to find a solution to help people who rely on public transport to access the surgery. Once the GP surgery has moved the area currently occupied by the porta cabins will be made into park land.

AVDC operates 17 car parks across the Vale, including 11 in Aylesbury. Some of the car parks are for short term parking only, while others are for long term parking.

Additionally, one of the car parks in Aylesbury (Anchor Lane) is exclusively for blue badge holders. Visitors coming to Aylesbury town centre for work or leisure can take advantage of Walton Street car park which, with 525 spaces, is the largest AVDC car park in Aylesbury. It's located just minutes from the heart of the town centre, next to the Ex-Servicemen's Club,

and the car park offers a pleasant and scenic stroll to the shops and restaurants, with the walkway passing by the canal and the award-winning Waterside Theatre. Unitary Council

The new unitary council offers an exciting new beginning for Buckinghamshire and positive change for residents and communities across the county.

Key Facts:

- The new unitary authority will be called Buckinghamshire Council.
- It will go live on 1 April 2020.
- All five existing county and district councils in Buckinghamshire will cease to exist on 31 March 2020.
- There will be 147 elected members on the new council (this works out as three per current county ward).
- Elections for the new Buckinghamshire Council will take place in May 2020, May 2025 and then every four years. Town and parish elections will coincide.

How will it affect me?

There will be no immediate changes to services so don't worry – your bins will still be collected as normal, the streets will still be cleaned and everything else you rely on day-to-day will carry on.

We will continue to keep you updated and inform you of any future service changes.



What are the benefits?

The new council will be more efficient and save money for taxpayers, helping to create a simpler, stronger and better value county-wide council.

Benefits of the unitary Buckinghamshire Council include:

Local level decision making

Through local working including working with parish and town councils, we will bring local services and decision making to your community.

Regional collaboration

Taking the best expertise from all five existing councils to make future services better for everyone across Buckinghamshire

Single point of contact

One council responsible for all services so you always know who to contact.

Increased buying power

As one single authority we will be stronger and have a larger voice regionally and nationally.

Improved services

Reduced costs will leave more to spend on improving the services that matter to you.

We have reached a milestone on the journey towards all five councils becoming one team and one new council. The Structural Changes Order - the final piece of legislation required to give the formal go ahead to begin setting up the new council - has now been passed by government.

The Shadow Authority's first meeting will consider the appointment of interim statutory officers: the head of paid service; monitoring officer and chief finance officer. Relevant committee members and county and district council nominations to the cabinet-style Shadow Executive will also be considered. The Shadow Executive will consist of 17 councillors; eight from the county council, eight from the district councils, and the Leader of the county council. It is scheduled to meet formally for the first time on 11 June at 10am at the New County Offices, Aylesbury and then every two weeks after that during this transition phase up to go live in April.

In preparation, on 21 May at the Gateway in Aylesbury the first get together of all elected members across the five councils was held (right).

This enabled councillors to learn more from officers about services across the councils.

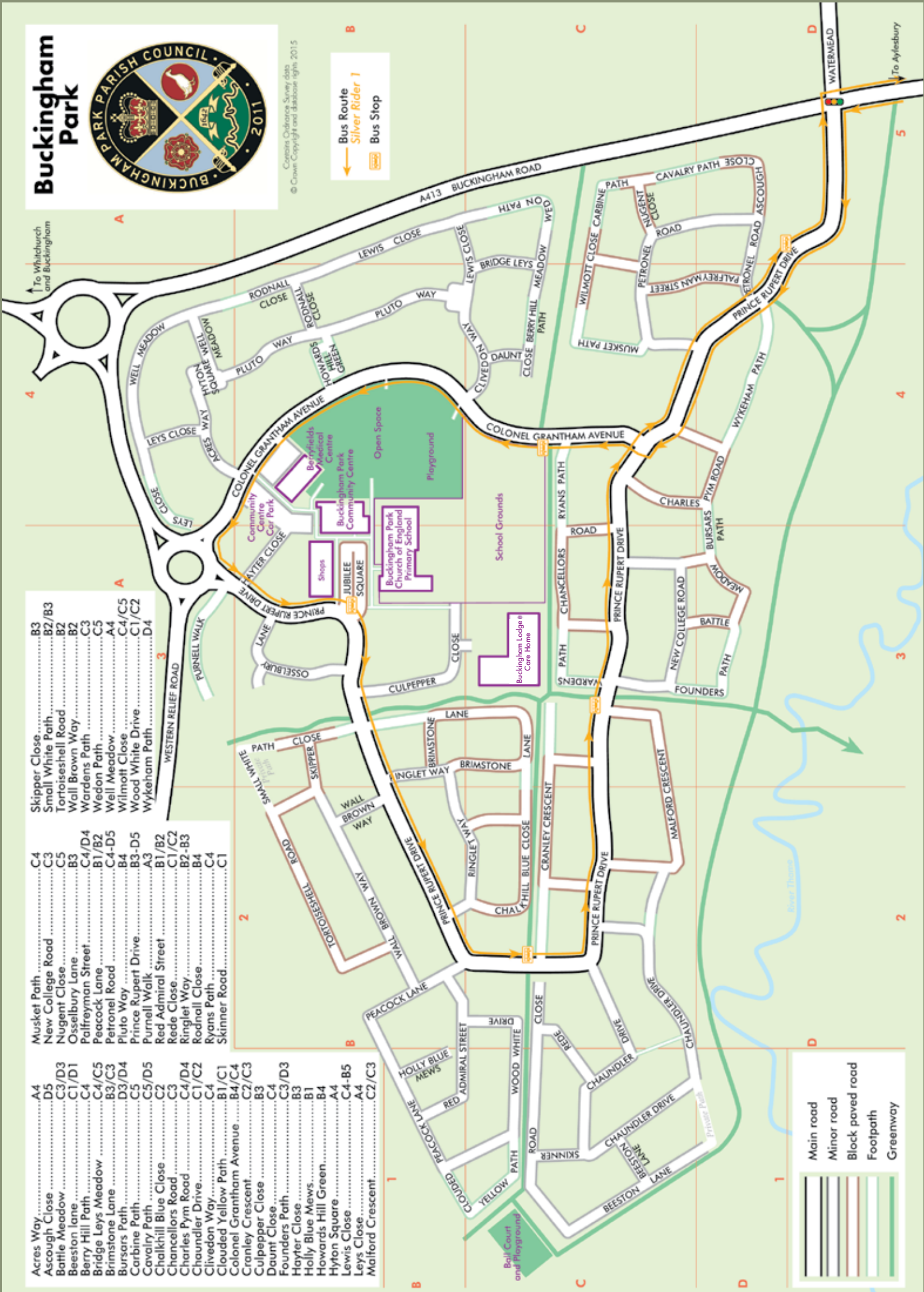
